

Photo guidelines for ID06-cards

Since the ID06-card is an identification document, the photo needs to fulfill the same rules as for a drivers license and passports.

- The photo should reflect your current appearance and should not be older than 6 months.
- The photo should be taken in full-face view facing directly at the camera.
- The photo should focus at head and upper shoulders so the head occupies 70-80% of the photograph.
- Both eyes must be open with visible pupils.
- The photo should be sharp and clear with pupils as focal point. There must be no glare and no shadow or reflection from eyeglasses.
- No sunglasses or dark eyeglasses are allowed.
- No hat, helmet or other head covering are allowed. Exceptions can be given for religious reasons, provided that the entire face is visible.
- The photo must be taken in full-face view, showing edges of your face clearly.
- Showing you facing square on to the camera, not looking over one shoulder (portrait style) or tilted.
- Lighting should be adjusted to avoid shadows and reflections.
- The colour of the background must be white.
- Both black and white and colored photos are accepted.
- At the photo, not other persons, animals etc can be visible.

The photo should be in .jpg format or .png format. A scanned photo or a copy of a photo will not be approved.
